Other topics under discussion will include smart solutions in the supply chain, author care, the second-hand book market and which books sell best in challenging economic times. The Conference's second morning is set aside for workshops, providing publishers with practical advice on a variety of subjects including online advertising, podcasts, rights, email marketing, management, events, sustainability and accessibility.

The Spring Conference has been revamped for 2023 to optimise accessibility, with content packed into a day and a half and a new venue at London's Shaw Theatre. Online access will also be available. As well as the sessions, there will be free business clinics on issues from finance to sustainability, networking breaks, an Exhibitors Zone with top suppliers and a dinner at the British Library on Monday.
